Terms & conditions for Cambridge OCR post-exam survey prize draw

The following Ts&Cs apply to Cambridge OCR's Post Exam Series Surveys 2026 survey prize draw (the "Prize Draw").

This Prize Draw is run by Cambridge OCR, at The Triangle Building, Shaftesbury Road, Cambridge, CB2 8EA. Registered in England, company number 03484466.

1. Eligibility

1.1 The Prize Draw will take place on 10 July 2026.

1.2 The Prize Draw is open to all participants aged 18 or over, residing in the UK, who teach a Cambridge OCR qualification (GCSE, A Level, Cambridge National, Cambridge Technical or Cambridge Advanced National) and are registered with a Cambridge centre.

1.3 An invitation to complete the survey will be communicated to participants (as specified in clause 1.2), via monthly newsletters, subject newsletters, marketing emails, teacher insight panel(s) and displayed on the Teach Cambridge platform. Participants will need to complete the survey by 8 July 2026 in order to be eligible for the Prize Draw. There will be 3 prize draw winners per survey. There will be 5 surveys in total, 1 per qualification type, GCSE, A Level, Cambridge Nationals, Cambridge Advanced Nationals and Cambridge Technicals, so 15 prize draw winners overall.

1.4 Entries are limited to one per participant. The Prize Draw is free to enter and no purchase is necessary.

1.5 Participants will need to provide their name and email address in order to claim the prize.

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2. Prize Draw General Terms

2.1 There shall be no cash substitute or alternative prize offered.

2.2 The prize is non-transferable.

2.3 The Prize Draw winner will be selected at random from all completed surveys submitted to Cambridge OCR.

2.4 The winner will be contacted by email within 7 days of the Prize Draw. Within 14 days, should Cambridge OCR be unable to contact the winner after reasonable attempts have been made or should the winner be unable to accept the prize, Cambridge OCR reserves the right to award the prize to an alternative winner, drawn in accordance with these terms and conditions. Only a winning entry will be contacted.

2.5 Cambridge OCR accepts no liability towards the prize, which is supplied “as is” with no express guarantee as to its suitability. Any faults or queries with the prize should be directed to Tremendous.

2.6 The prize is a one off £50 e-voucher supplied by Tremendous.

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3. General

3.1 The winner may be publicly announced via Cambridge OCR's social media channels.

3.2 Cambridge OCR reserves the right to hold void, withdraw, suspend, cancel or amend the prize draw where it becomes necessary to do so, or at any time.

3.3 Cambridge OCR reserves the right to substitute the prize at any time.

3.4 Cambridge OCR reserves the right to disqualify any entry that it believes, in its sole discretion, to be in breach of these Ts&Cs.

3.5 Cambridge OCR's decision is final and no correspondence will be entered into.

3.6 Cambridge OCR will not sell your personal information to others or release it to others without your prior consent, and will only use your personal data as outlined in Cambridge OCR's website privacy policy (see: <https://www.ocr.org.uk/about/our-policies/website-policies/privacy-policy/>).

3.7 Cambridge OCR reserves the right to amend these terms and conditions at any time.

3.8 Employees of Cambridge OCR and its group of organisations including Cambridge University Press & Assessment will not be eligible to participate.
